Biographies

Godefroy Grosjean, Climate Policy Scientist - CIAT

Dr. Godefroy Grosjean is Climate Policy Scientist at the International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CGIAR). He has initiated and leads the CIAT Asia Climate Policy Hub (CPH) in Hanoi (Vietnam) to provide actionable research that supports governments and multilateral donors in designing and implementing climate strategies and investment plans in agriculture. In this endeavor, the CPH uses a set of qualitative and quantitative methodologies to prioritize Climate Smart Agriculture interventions and assess their socio-economic impacts. Godefroy also co-leads CIAT Global Initiative on Agricultural Risk Management.



Godefroy has ten years of work experience blending research on climate policy and climate smart agriculture with management and implementation of development projects.

Godefroy's previous work experience include the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research (PIK), GIZ (China), UNDP (Vietnam), the Climate Policy Initiative (Germany), the UK Department of Energy and Climate Change as well as PwC (Luxembourg). He holds a PhD on climate policy from the Technical University (Berlin). His PhD research focused on carbon markets and more specifically the reform of the European Emissions Trading System (EU ETS). Prior to that Godefroy obtained master degrees in economics and public administration from Maastricht University, the London School of Economics and the Hertie School of Governance.

Alberto Millan, Senior Climate Finance Specialist - CIAT

Alberto Millan is a Senior Climate Finance Specialist at the International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT), where he leads the sustainable finance strategy of the CGIAR Research Program on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food security (CCAFS). His work focuses on harnessing the power of finance to advance sustainable development, with a specific focus on bridging the gap between the agriculture finance and climate finance communities.

Previously, he was an Agricultural Specialist at the World Bank Global Food and Agriculture Practice in Washington DC, where he advised internal and external clients on sustainable, and particularly climate, finance related issues. Before that, Alberto worked as a management consultant and an agriculture and financial inclusion expert for several UN agencies and INGOs based out of Europe, Africa and Asia.

He holds a BA and MA in Economics from Universidad Rey Juan Carlos de Madrid, Spain, a Master in Microfinance and Financial Inclusion from Universidad Autonoma de Madrid, Spain, a Diploma in Enterprise Development through Value Chains and Business Service Markets from ITC-ILO, and its currently completing an expert certification on Sustainable Finance from Frankfurt School of Finance and Management.

Evan Girvetz, Senior Scientist – CIAT

Dr. Evan Girvetz is a Senior Scientist with the International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT), part of the CGIAR. He researches climate-smart agriculture and sustainable food systems. He is the Africa lead for CIATs Decision and Policy Analysis research area. He also co-leads the development of the Climate Wizard (http://ClimateWizard.org), an online tool that allows non-climate specialists to explore climate change maps and analyses.

Evan has extensive experience researching climate change adaptation, agricultural planning, environmental decision support, water resources management, climate services, and nature conservation planning. He is widely published and his research has been featured in top media outlets including the San Francisco Chronicle, Seattle Times and New Scientist magazine. Evan received his Ph.D. in Ecology from the University of California, Davis, and currently holds an



affiliate assistant professor position at the University of Washington, School of Forest Resources.
